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Now that to me, it tells me that they are doing...they're looking at both sides of the situation. It is still discretionary. The commission has the right to do and handle those cases as they feel. You can go and...you can go and plead your case in front of them. They're human beings like anyone else. They're going to listen to you. But when we talk about the retailer is going to be closed, even if it's he cannot sell alcohol for a couple of days, it all depends upon where the area is at. It all depends upon where the area, what area you're in. Sometimes your sales in a food store can be, a good portion of that could be alcohol. You have people come in, they want to buy a 12-pack of beer, and they're going to buy the rest of their groceries, they want a one stop anymore. That, you know what I'm talking about. They want to be able to get all of their goods in one place, so if they can't get their 6-pack of beer, they may go across the street to somebody else. So the retailer is losing something there, not just the money it takes to buy out, but he's also going to lose customers. And when you lose a customer and they go somewhere else, they may stay over there. So you may have lost that customer for good. So you start weighing that, a retailer is paying a lot more, Senator Landis, than just that fine.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: It's going to cost him a lot more in the long run too. Not all situations, but there can be those situa...I know...I know how people...their shopping habits. I have been in that business long enough, I understand what they're doing. Once you get a customer in another store, they may stay there for awhile. They could come back but, in the meantime, you're going to lose some business. So when we say that all they're going to pay is that fine, that's not exactly true. It really doesn't work that way. If you lose a customer that spends 100, 150 dollars a week with you, take that times 52 weeks, you're going to notice that. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, I can understand the different parties involved in this who want the bill. They got a lot from me by my not dividing the question or speaking
