SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'll tell you why I think Jesus was crucified. He just got tired of it. He said, it's not even worth it; do whatever you want to do. Let me out of here. And he went on out. But I'm not going to be gotten rid of that easily. You think if I had the power to call down fire, smoke, and brimstone on people, I'm going to let them hang me up on a tree and drive nails through me and stick pins and swords and spears in my body and put crowns of thorns on my head and call me all kinds of names?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion? Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor and members of the Legislature. Senator Landis was explaining how we still...we have fines now. It...a pretty stiff fine that can be, can be imposed upon a minor who attempts to or does procure alcohol or consumes it. Those are pretty stiff fines. And Senator Hilgert's amendment, those fines are also pretty stiff. If you start talking to a young person about their, about their driver's license, that's about the most important thing to a young person there is. And I believe they will listen. I don't think they fear the fines now, because they're never handed down to them. Not to my knowledge. And if someone could...if someone could show me where the minors who are trying to get the...or, procuring the alcohol, and where they have been given this sentence, I'd certainly like to see it. So with something like a \$250 fine on the first offense and six months driver's license suspension, maybe they would take notice of that. There again, it has to be carried out. If it isn't carried out, they're going to laugh at that, too. I see under the AM 1719 that it would be mandatory...mandatory penalties for minors in possession. I hate to see that, but if that's what it's going to take to get someone's attention...and Senator Chambers alluded to, you know, that sometimes we do things we don't intend on having done it turns out. In his parables, with Jesus being marched in on an ass, one week later being crucified...well, I'm not out to crucify anybody. It seems as though we're doing a pretty good job of that with the retailers right now. We're putting all the blame onto them. But on the other hand, they're the ones that are also profiting from it, so
