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violation of the law. But we don't take that person's driver's license. Let me ask Senator Baker a couple more questions before I make a misstatement.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Baker?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Baker, is that adult subject to being put in jail?

SENATOR BAKER: Are you talking about the retailer doing this?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yeah, the retailer.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes. Well, I...I don't know that you'd be subjected to jail. You'd lose...it's obviously part of the license suspension process, and a fine. But I don't know what...if there's a jail sentence involved.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would he lose his driver's license?

SENATOR BAKER: No. That retailer would not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How many times would the retailer have to do this before losing the license for good, if you know?

SENATOR BAKER: I don't know that. I...that's a serious violation of the liquor laws. I don't know what the penalty would be on that. I think it'd be a license suspension, and follow through with the various procedures to where I...after a couple times of that, I think you'd have your license revoked.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So this alcohol is a volatile liquid, and it's necessary to state on the label what kind of form, or what the concentration of the alcohol is that you're selling.

SENATOR BAKER: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Baker. I'm wondering then why it's licensed for sale. It's dangerous, people have car wrecks, they kill people, but it's for sale. And adults are the
