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Senator Tyson one day when we were talking about being spanked as children and that if you ever saw a kid being hit, you'd knock their head off. You remember that? So I know that you're not serious about your amendment, and it's good that you're able to get up and talk about it. And that's fine, and I understand that. I guess, getting back to the issue of Senator Hilgert's amendment to this piece of legislation, I really liked what Senator Schrock had to say. I think it hits the nail right on the head. We do need somehow to get the attention of these young people, and to figure out some way to wean them away from the desire to want to buy alcohol and drink alcohol before they're the age that...as far as I'm concerned, they don't have to drink at any age. I agree with Senator Chambers. It'd be good if we took alcohol away from everybody. We know that's not going to happen. But we have a situation that probably, undoubtedly needs some control, and I think it's up to this body to at this point take a stand and decide, do we want to somehow save some lives, save some lives by putting some kind of penalties on kids who illegally buy and consume alcohol. Now, the fact of the matter of it is, I don't think anybody on the floor up to this point has disagreed that fines, even though there are fines in place, apparently they're not being...Senator Landis, could I ask you a question?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Landis, would you yield?

SENATOR VRTISKA: There was a lot of discussion earlier about the fines that are now in place. They're not being very well attended to, are they?

SENATOR LANDIS: This is the public record in the Lincoln Journal for yesterday. Jeffrey Latimer (phonetic), a minor, attempted to purchase alcohol. Two hundred and fifty dollars fine. That's about half of what a retailer would pay for exactly the same offense. By the way, the retailer's going to profit the rest of the day. Minor in possession. Jared Yokum (phonetic), Kearney. Five hundred dollars, which is every bit of what a retailer would probably pay for that offense if it was their first offense. This is yesterday, May 11, one for trying to buy alcohol, and one for being in possession. Total amount of fines against minors, 750 bucks. As far as I'm concerned, there isn't a single thing in here about the lifting of a
