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If you want to keep that simple number that you've had on your car for years, that's fine. The other question I have is what if that...if that particular vehicle has AA111, what if that vehicle is sold and the person does not need a license anymore? Will that...will that number be reissued to another car, or will they have to get...will that number just be dropped then? Senator Bromm, could you answer that for me?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Yeah, we're not, Senator Janssen, we're not changing that. That's existing law. It could be issued to another vehicle.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. So if that vehicle is no longer registered...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...then that particular number could be issued to someone else...

SENATOR BROMM: That's...that's right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...as it is now. I mean, you go to the courthouse and you say, I'd like a low number, well, if that number is available you can have it if it has...if it isn't used by someone else. That's the way it is now.

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: So that would be the same situation. That number will stay there in the depository and if someone asks for that number they could probably have it.

SENATOR BROMM: Right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right.

SENATOR BROMM: Right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you. Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant
