PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Thompson. Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the body, I'm going to have to stand up because my area says no to this kind of plates out there because they want identification. I don't know how many of you can remember back when the bill came to the Transportation Committee about changing 4 and 59, and that was a big, big deal at that time. So hopefully that something like that won't happen again. But, anyway, what I wanted to say is I was on the Transportation Committee and the reason I supported this out of that was because there are three largest counties that handle the most number of plates. It's going to save the most dollars on this situation, because they have to handle a lot of plates and they have to have a lot of storage room, and this way they don't have to order all the plates at once. They can be spread through the year in two or three different groups so they don't have to have them there all at once. And another thing, I think if we go ahead and do this and give the other counties the option, well, that will...that will cure the problem for a long time. I know I have a...I've had one or two phone calls from other counties that said that, well, we want to change over, too, because we don't have the storage for our plates. Well, if the county board in them counties that's having the problems want to do it, they can vote to do it. I don't know if...I guess that'd be a good way to get off the county board if you'd let that motion in and pass it, because I imagine you wouldn't be on the next election. But, anyway, that's beside the point right now, because I think this will save the dollars for them three counties and I think that's what we should go ahead and do, is go ahead and put this on so that we can give them the option, what...they're the ones that came to us and asked this question, so I think we should go ahead and do this, and that way all the other counties can be left up to their own discretion of what they want to do.
