of gas and they have to refill it?

SENATOR KIEL: They might want to get gas in it to be able to use it for demonstration, or it may not have gas in it in the first place. I would imagine there are a number of reasons, one would be if they needed to do some engine repair and needed to have gas in it, to see whether or not the engine was running correctly.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And this applies to one person, is that true?

SENATOR KIEL: The...the bill...the repossession plate?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This...this amendment, it's here because of one person?

SENATOR KIEL: Yes, I have a constituent who has a small business that, you know, needed to be able to store cars without being ticketed for having a repossessed car.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What happens to all the other repo men and women in the state, if you know?

SENATOR KIEL: Well, the statute would apply to them, too. By the way, the license plate has a big "R" on it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And these other people are not being ticketed, as far as you know this is the only person receiving tickets?

SENATOR KIEL: I received this information because it's a constituent and that may well be happening, I just don't know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And could you give me an idea where the vehicle will be parked when he gets a ticket, if you know?

SENATOR KIEL: In the driveway of the business.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And they come on his property and give a ticket?

SENATOR KIEL: Yes.
