SENATOR CHAMBERS: On private property?

SENATOR KIEL: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And what do they ticket it for?

SENATOR KIEL: Having...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you say this has happened repeatedly?

SENATOR KIEL: Well, I think probably the spirit of the statute is intended so that you can take, you know, if you have a repossessed car you can take care of it, do with it what you need to do with it before you either sell it or make arrangements for disposal of it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR KIEL: I think...I think probably being able to maintain the vehicle or parking it for the time being, or taking it for gas meets the same...meets the spirit of the statute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you said that this bill had a hearing and came out without any objection?

SENATOR KIEL: Twice.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And where is it now, the bill itself?
