SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, he said he was going to the gas station, that doesn't mean he was, though.

SENATOR KIEL: Absolutely not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Most people who get tickets for speeding, say, I wasn't speeding. But at any rate...and some people like me go to court and prove it. But at any rate, this person has gotten tickets while the car was on the parking lot of the business. Do you know how many times...would that have been about 10 or 15 times?

SENATOR KIEL: Probably the majority of the time it was when it was parked.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would it be the same officer, do you know, giving the ticket?

SENATOR KIEL: I wouldn't...I wouldn't hazard a guess; it's in the same general area.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did he ever talk to the city prosecutor?

SENATOR KIEL: This...my constituent? I do not know if he actually talked to the city prosecutor. I do know that the tickets were subsequently dismissed when they went to court.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It seems to me, members of the Legislature, that this is one of those areas where a person could talk to a prosecutor, talk to the chief, if it seems that there is some kind of harassment going on. Now the bill probably will...I meant the amendment probably will be adopted, but I'm not going to vote for it. I'm not in favor of changing the law for one person. And if you all vote to change this law for one person, a rationale ought to be given. I can find individuals who have problems which they would like to have solved by a law being passed for them, so that the problem could not exist for them anymore. I have not been given a persuasive reason to change a statute, to change a statute. And, if this is not the only repo person in Omaha, where are the others? They'd all be getting
