SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Kiel, on your amendment.

SENATOR KIEL: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Actually what my constituent was told, when he was in court several different times, is the judge, the presiding judge said, you know what you need to do, you need to go get the law changed. So actually, that's where this originally proceeds from. I'm not going to try to bog down the bill, you know, if this presents a problem. But I think probably most of us at one time or another do originally bring legislation that's suggested to them from constituents. Now I do not know whether or not there are other people who are in the same situation as this constituent. I do know that...that he's having...he has had difficulty in the past with this, and that it was suggested to him, by the...by the judge in the court that he was in several times with regard to the tickets, that the law ought to be changed, because what we're looking for is to allow people who do this to at least have the ability to store cars or gas them up or fix them or whatever in order...in the course of their business. So this is pretty much on behalf of a small business that may not necessarily have the resources that a large business might have. And I think probably what this amendment does is meet the spirit of the statute originally. With that, I would ask again that the Legislature approve this amendment.
