SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Senator Schimek on the bracket motion.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes. Mr. President, members of the body, I think that that may have been the only time when I've been speechless on the floor of this Legislature, when Senator Tyson objected to the motion to bracket until January 15. I did want to save the body some time. And if there is no interest in advancing the bill at this point, I would like to have it sit over the summer, and I would like to think about it and talk with different individual and see if there are any amendments which improve it. Maybe there won't be any amendments which will improve it. And maybe we'll never take it up again. But I would like to leave it sitting there. I suppose the other option is, it could go away and I could reintroduce the bill. We could kill it and I could reintroduce the bill next year. I would simply ask that you support the motion to bracket until January 15 of 2000.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Tyson, you're recognized on the bracket motion.

SENATOR TYSON: Yes. Mr. President, when they asked for unanimous consent, I heard nothing from this part of the room. (Laughter.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: I take it you're withdrawing your objection?

SENATOR TYSON: What objection is that, sir? Yes, I am withdrawing it. Now you forced it out of me. Are you happy?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Quandahl, you're recognized.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Yes. Thank you. Appropriately chastised, I also didn't hear anything from this portion of the chamber and I'd withdraw the objection that I had.
