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use, are they now going to pay the tax on that 75-foot strip although it's for public use, it's part of their access from their property to get to the lake? So it's part of...I recognize, yes.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Are you done?

SENATOR BOHLKE: That's my question.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Okay.

SENATOR BOHLKE: I don't know if I'm done until you answer it.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: I don't know if you're done either. And the 75 foot buffer strip is a little bit confusing to me because I'm afraid I don't have a clear picture of what these things are. Are there improvements in the 75 foot or improvements outside the 75 foot area?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Inside.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: They're inside and the 75 foot strip is leased. You're leasing a chunk of the 75 foot strip and you put a house on it or a cabin or whatever these things are. Is that what you do?

SENATOR BOHLKE: No, you, as I understand it, there's a 75 foot strip that's there that is public use that's apart from, next to the water.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator Kristensen described it as a buffer strip. Let me just...I'm almost to the point of saying I don't know because I can't...I don't know what these things...

SENATOR BOHLKE: It sounds close to I don't care.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Well, I do care but, Senator, I don't know if I can give you a legitimate answer. I don't have a clear picture of what this arrangement is. I don't know whether the buildings are inside the 75 foot strip.

SENATOR BOHLKE: They are inside.
