I don't...that's the last thing you need is to have some loose cannon coming through a flashing lights or, you know, and when they see that there is an emergency up there, especially at night. In the daytime, you can see what's happening, so I really don't see too much of a problem with Senator Hudkins' amendment and I will be supporting that. I...unless I can see...unless someone can bring up something that is different and, to me, that sounds like it's fine. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Crosby, on the Hudkins amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I turned my light on because I wasn't sure if others were going to speak and I thought I saw four lawyers over here, surrounding the...and one law enforcement officer, trying to figure out what to do about this amendment, so I thought maybe some of us needed to talk. But I do have two things that I am...I am concerned about what Senator Hudkins has brought in this particular amendment because I...surely, I know there are laws on the books right now for people who do not honor emergency vehicles when they're going through traffic. Yesterday, twice I saw this happen, an ambulance going down 17th Street going north, and I always pull over and then I feel like, well, there must be something wrong with me because everybody else keeps going. I don't want to be run over by an ambulance, and it does happen. Fire trucks run into people. I had a good friend years ago who got hit by a fire truck out here on Highway 2 because she went through the light, didn't see him coming or whatever. But the second thing is...the other thing I saw within the last week is right out here on H Street, a school bus stopped, with the arm out, letting some children out. I stopped and some people behind me stopped. A woman coming...a woman, which really bothered me, came from the other way and went around that school bus with the stop out. Who can...a bus driver can't get off and give her a ticket. But the problem is, I think, is that as usual we have drivers who do not pay attention or they do not know the rules of the road. They don't know, perhaps, that when you see flashing lights and fire trucks and so on bearing down on you, that you're supposed to stop, pull over and let those
