PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. Mr. President, I would like to have a short dialog with Senator Bromm, if I may.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bromm, would you yield?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR TYSON: Senator Bromm, you're aware of the subject matter of my amendment...

SENATOR BROMM: That's correct.

SENATOR TYSON: ...which is in...concerning open containers in passenger compartment and open containers in motor homes or trailers.

SENATOR BROMM: Correct.

SENATOR TYSON: The next amendment down is yours, and it is in direct conflict with mine. I guess from a procedural standpoint, would you go along with me passing this over until yours has been discussed, or would you prefer to have me go forward now?

SENATOR BROMM: Senator Tyson, it's certainly your decision, but it would be...it would be, I think, helpful to the discussion if we would slide your amendment to third place after the next two amendments, to get those things straightened out, and then come with your amendment which would...which would alter a couple of sections of these, but I think that would be a better order, if
