federal provisions and which I think makes it clear that this applies to beverages and not...and not fruitcakes. I said fruitcakes (laugh), and I don't want to offend anyone...and that trace amounts are not included within the definition of an alcoholic beverage. Also in response to floor debate, we found that we could add a provision which allows that the back part of an SUV or minivan can be excluded from the passenger compartment. And the passenger area means, as a result of this amendment, that that's the area designed to seat the passenger...the driver and passengers while the motor vehicle is in operation, and any area that is readily accessible to the driver or passenger while in their seating position, which would include like a glove compartment or this compartment in the...maybe the center between two bucket seats in the front or something, but the passenger area under this definition does not include the area behind the last upright seat of the motor vehicle if the area is not normally occupied by the driver or passenger and if the motor vehicle is not equipped with a trunk, so it's specifically designed to give those vehicles such as sports utility vehicles or minivans or regular size vans a place to transport an alcoholic beverage. With respect to repeat offenders of the DUI law, DWI law, several changes are in this amendment, at least one of which was already voted on in concept by the Legislature. Throughout the bill, the use of immobilization of Section 6 of the bill is made mandatory, whether or not the person is on probation by the court. Alcohol evaluations are mandatory in the case of any conviction for DUI, and that's required under the federal provisions. Work permits pursuant to 60-6196, subsection (5) are limited to first time offenders. No work permits for repeat offenders. And these changes, if the body chooses to adopt them, and I would hope that you would, are directly a result of either floor debate or further understanding and clarification of what the federal requirements are. And I think we have...I feel with this amendment and the next one, that at least I am presenting you with a bill which, if you do agree to support it, will put us in compliance and in a position to access the additional highway funds. And it is an additional tightening up of the...of the alcohol provisions as they relate to driving. I did, just to try to keep the forest in perspective, for fear that we look at the trees too carefully and forget to look at the big picture, I did hand out a recent article on the drunken driving efforts
