PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Tyson, in your area, are there service stations, filling stations, gas stations, or by whatever term designated, which sell ethanol at the pump?

SENATOR TYSON: Yes, sir, 10 percent.

SENATOR TYSON: No. They have a liquor license that allows them to sell beer.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If under this definition of alcoholic beverage ethanol is listed, then shouldn't a person have to have a liquor license to dispense it?

SENATOR TYSON: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, so you think eth...alcoholic liquors should be dispensable without having a liquor license, for sale to the public?

SENATOR TYSON: Are you speaking about rubbing alcohol now, Senator, or are you speaking about the alcohol in the gasoline?
