SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Engel. Senator Stuhr, on the amendment.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature. I would like to continue my discussion with Senator Hartnett. In relation particularly to the waiver issue, we said that a community could choose to have a waiver. Now, could...for a year, now could they do that for more than one year?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Will you yield, Senator Hartnett?

SENATOR HARTNETT: In the bill, Senator Stuhr, it's only for one year.

SENATOR STUHR: It would only be for one year.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah.

SENATOR STUHR: And then when...I imagine would the Fire Marshal or who would provide...would someone provide that list to the Appropriations Committee? I mean would those people be on that list then?

SENATOR HARTNETT: If they're off...yes, the Fire Marshal would do that, Senator Stuhr, yes.

SENATOR STUHR: The Fire Marshal?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah, yeah.

SENATOR STUHR: Okay. I also have another question in regard to the fiscal impact. We know that it is not going to be a huge fiscal impact, particularly the first couple years. But is the State Fire Marshal, will they be needing extra staff for all of the recordkeeping that they will be needing to do?

SENATOR HARTNETT: According to our conversation, Senator Stuhr, with the Fire Marshal, probably one additional person.

SENATOR STUHR: Okay. And I haven't looked at what are we estimating, you know, for the first year or two? We really
