very good option, because they can use some of the information that was already gathered for this, from this task force, but that there were several things lacking. And we can disagree over whether that was a good study or not. But this is one that we, the Legislature, probably need to keep control over and how it's done. That would be...concept one is a study on how to comply. And I think Senator Jensen has been deeply involved and is...probably, I hope, will speak to we've come to that conclusion that this is not a matter of if we should do this, it's a matter of, yes, we have to, and how we do it. The next one is we do create a State Disbursement Unit, and that's an SDU. There are so many acronyms here, I get lost. So when I talk about the state...the central unit, that's what I'm referring to, that we make a commitment that we're going to create the unit. However, who's going to administer it? Who's going to run it, or who's going to coordinate it, I think, needs to still remain, and I think a number of people think the Legislature still needs to have some control over this. What are some of the options? Well, one of the options would be you could have another agency, you could have Health and Human Services do it. Some people want the State Treasurer to do it. Some people want an entire private company to do it. Other people think that the clerk's, if you want to keep people who have done this over the years, that the clerks could form a group similar to their risk management group, where they come together and form a separate entity to do those things. There's a wide variety of options out there. We don't make the choice in the amendment, we say, Legislature, you ought to do it. Now, Senator Chambers, I told you that when I thought there were some issues, this is one of them where I can't tell you I know all the answers to this. But I'll tell you, there is the issue of separation of powers with this provision. Can the Legislature say, yes, we're going to create the entity? But to who runs it, who operates it and does it, can that...can the Legislature do that, or is that an executive branch function? What I throw out to you is the possibility would be, let them...let them make a recommendation and treat it as a confirmation. This would be in Section 2, it's at the bottom of page 1. That's an option to avoid that issue. I hope we debate that, because that's something that...that I think is a legitimate point to discuss. The third point, the third concept that I believe is important is to get us all on the same computer system. Section 5 of this
