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you write two or three bad checks that...

SENATOR COORDSEN: One minute.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: ...from then on you're going to have to do things like cash or money ready funds, if you've been a bad actor and given us bad checks. But we've got to make some progress in that two-day turnaround time matches what the federal government is after, and that's the reason we put it in the amendment. I know my time is running out, and there's going to be a variety of other people who've been involved in this. And I can't hold out to you that everybody agrees with this, but I think that there's...to me this is the framework of where we begin, because we can't pass the bill in its present form. If we do that, we're going to lose, not only \$15 million, but you're going to lose the \$50 million, and we're really going to face some problems. So I would suggest this is the beginning of a fairly decent framework. Senator Brown has worked very, very hard on this bill. And I think everybody is going to...is willing to...to take her heed that we've got to pass something that's going to pass federal muster. The issue is, what do we do? We offer this amendment as the place to start. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Time. Senator Quandahl, please.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I do have a few questions. And I will say, just as some background, that as I am a lawyer, a couple of weeks ago I had the opportunity to be on the phone with a judge that I respect in the eastern part of the state. And I told him that we were grappling with the issue of centralized child support, and I asked just to hear what his...what his thoughts were on that. And he said, well, I can tell you right now that the district court staff don't like it at all. But, he said, I can also tell you that since we've decided to accept federal money, it's a little bit like making a deal with the devil, and sometimes, when you dance with the devil, you have to pay the price. And he said, I'm afraid, Senator Quandahl, that centralized child support collection is the deal that we've gotten ourselves into. So, I, like many of the other people in here, do not like the idea of a federal mandate. And coming from Douglas County, I'm also aware that the computer system
