major liability, potential liability, to the low-level liability, we're sitting, in my opinion, in a very uncomfortable position. And I don't want this matter on my mind, the low-level thing is bad enough.

SENATOR COORDSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And so I hope whatever we do at this stage of debate, everybody can feel comfortable that it's going to be enough to keep us from losing federal funds, because that would be disastrous. And this amendment, unless you change it radically, you're going to have to change one of the two amendments substantially to come up with my sense of what I think we're looking for. But you can't start with the Kristensen amendment, because it's unconstitutional, plain and simple. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Raikes, please.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I would like to pursue a discussion with Senator Brown a little bit, if...that apparently isn't going to happen right now. Let me go on with a couple other things. Going back to the comments by Senator Baker and then Senator Bohlke, Senator Baker mentioned our collection rate as being very good as compared to other states. And Senator Bohlke mentioned customer service as being a very important issue in Nebraska. Apparently, the federal government, in their regulations, are not looking nearly as...as strongly on those two criteria as they are two others. One that was mentioned was the two-day turnaround, and another one is simply the cost. I did want to...oh, Senator Brown is there. Senator Brown, what would you say are the main criteria that the...or the goals, if you will, of the federal government in seeing these revised regulations implemented?

SENATOR BROWN: Well, I think,...

SENATOR BROWN: ...that collection of child support underlies it
