whatever we do, we do in a way that we are...we are in good faith, moving towards a central disbursement unit. We are in good faith attempting to meet the time lines that have been set out. We are in good faith, knowing that we are moving forward on a single disbursement unit. And I cannot echo what Senator Jensen has said more strongly, what some other people have said, we must do something, we must do something that convinces the feds that we are serious about this. We must do it now, and we must not do something that is going to...where we can congratulate ourselves for a couple of months that we passed something and then still leave ourselves in the position that we are going to be sanctioned. And so I am looking very closely at aspects of the Kristensen amendment that I have some concerns with, that especially have to do with time lines and what...what the federal government needs to have in place to...to be convinced that we are honestly trying to move forward with this system. And I will be continuing to look at those aspects. I am still not certain that everybody has completely come to a consensus that we are going to move forward with a single disbursement unit. And so I would ask you that if you have any questions about that, then you need to be speaking on the Kristensen amendment, working on the Kristensen amendment, because my amendment is the one that allows, within the parameters set forth by the federal government, allows for us to pursue a waiver. Do not move forward on the Kristensen amendment or any version, other than my amendment I would say, with the assumption that we are going to change course on the establishment of a single disbursement unit, because we will not be changing course. We will be establishing a single disbursement unit that will be a single disbursement unit for all the child support collection. How we go about it will be...continue to be debated, not whether we go about it. And so if you have any question about that, then you're better off in looking at my amendment than you are in looking at the Kristensen amendment, because the Kristensen amendment, if it gets into a form that...a time line form that I can live with, precludes us looking at a waiver. It assumes that we plan to go forward with the single disbursement unit. Thank you.
