It's not something that was thrown in our lap last week or even six months ago. Here we are at the deadline and we still don't have these programs up and these programs up and running and so on. Centralized child support sounds fine, but we're still going to have to adjust or address the individual who walks into the clerk's office, says here's my money, whether it's check or what, and that brings up another point, we've discussed the bad checks. PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: ...take the check from and who not. This bill or the amendment does address that. The state's responsible for those, so that we do adhere to the 48-hour turnaround. I think I've answered the question of Senator Raikes to the best of my ability that I can as to why the study. The checks are addressed in the amendment. We do, in fact, have established the Support Payment Cash Fund, so that we have accountability; that's Section 6 of the amendment.
