support payments. Then the state will...they will administer and operate that system either by a private entity, which I...I understand there may be a problem with using that, or...or a state officer, as designated by the Legislature, upon the recommendation of the Title IV Division. That entity or officer will be...that design...designated officer or entity will be entirely responsible then for the Title IV Division, and I think that there is not a better place for us to start that discussion or to head that discussion is the Exec Board. We have a good cross-section of legislators on the Exec Board and that we can be proud of, and that we're going to have to make sure that we comply with the federal requirements regarding the collection and distribution of those payments and not lose track of the custodial parent. Don't let...put them off in the corner somewhere where they have no place to go. This, I think, was Senator Chambers' big...big issue, too. You know, we have to have some place for those parents, the custodial parents, to go and have their questions answered. We have to...the study that will be conducted will be how to comply with the federal mandates, even though they are set out in federal statute, and, in my opinion, it wouldn't be too...too very hard to comply with them. I don't know what the rules and regulations are, but I do know what the federal statute says. So I don't believe there will be any problem with getting that efficiently worked out and so that we'll be efficient and effective. And we need the high enforcement rate and superior customer service to go along with this. And I believe that the on, you know, on or after October 1st of 1999, until the State Disbursement Unit establishes...gets established, I don't see any reason in the world why we can't get an extension, if we are trying to comply. I don't believe it's going to take that long, I really don't. I believe that we can...that we'll be able to get something in place quite quickly. In the meantime, I do hope that the federal government looks at the type of system that we do have here in this state...
