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SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Yes, and there have to...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...or somebody within IV-D prob...well, yeah.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: It could be. You're also...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Could be somebody within IV-D.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: ...going to have to help...you're going to have to give those county attorneys some assistance in proving the bad check in court too because the bad check may well be issued to the state and they're going to have to certify that back, you know, to assist somebody for evidentiary purposes in the bad check. I...there are some of those things that are going to have to get worked on too.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Worked on too, that's a terrible grammatical statement. They're going to have to be worked with. That's probably not even better, but...

SENATOR BEUTLER: That's a preposition at the end of the sentence, Senator.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: That's right.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time. Further discussion on the Kristensen amendment? Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Mr. President, I need to confer with staff for just a moment. I don't wish to yield my time.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: You have your closing left, Senator.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Mr. President, I'm going to ask a favor of the Chair. I'm going to ask that we'd stand at ease for just a moment, because I understand we do have the amendment and, instead of having...unless there's someone else that wants to debate, I would ask that we'd stand at ease for just a moment till we physically get the amendment. And if it exceeds a ten-minute, then you should ask for me to close on this
