different sides, if you want to call them that, working together in the way that they were, I felt that we would probably get the best that is possible on an issue like this, and I feel at this point that what we have here is the best that we'll probably get. But if there are other amendments, I will listen to them, but I'm going to try to have nothing else to say on the matter.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you. Thank you, Senator Chambers, and I do want to acknowledge the fact that you and I have had considerable discussions over this bill in the last two to three weeks and you may not have been up doing the talking or negotiating, but certainly there's concepts that you have that are into here that are vital and certainly Senator Brown and Senator Jensen, Senator Bohlke, Senator Janssen, Senator Baker have been extremely helpful. And I...I want to focus back on the issue of who would challenge, though, Senator. I think there is another group and I want to just lay that out for the body and want you to read between the lines a little bit. Someone who is not successful who would like to be the administrator or operator may think that they were slighted and the only way to get back into the game would be to sue. Depending on who that is, they may use the public's attorney or they may use a private attorney, but if that's going to happen there's significant consequences for that challenge, and those significant challenges are putting us out of compliance for \$15 million of child support money, but also the TANF funds which are the temporary funds for needy families. You'd be taking money, if you chose to file suit and were successful, for your own private gain, you'd be taking, more likely than not, you'd be taking money away from those families and that's what people need to consider if they're not successful here; that this is not just an opportunity for economic gain; that you really have got a lot of women and children and people who are relying on those funds. And so I would hope that they would take that into consideration. I would be happy to answer any other questions and would hope that you'd vote for this amendment. Thank you.
