plant out there and perhaps we can get another one. And so the wheat growers, I'm speaking for myself and the president, we're going to try that. We're going to take a look at it and see. We may have some support there from the wheat growers again. So I'm...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BAKER: ...opposing the Wickersham...is that time?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, yes, sir.

SENATOR BAKER: Oh, I am sorry, didn't hear. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Baker. Senator Schrock, on the Wickersham amendment.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is my seventh session and in those seven years I have supported a lot of projects that have not directly benefitted my legislative district. I signed onto the convention center bill right away this session. I don't know if it's going to do my legislative district any good, but if it's good for Omaha it's good for Nebraska. I have always supported LB 775. I wasn't here when it originally passed, but I've always supported it. I supported the Caterpillar bill. That doesn't help Phelps County much, nor south central Nebraska much. I voted for the Micron bill and, Senator Wickersham, I hope in the terms of boxing this isn't hitting below the belt, but I even voted for the restoration of Fort Robinson. (Laugh) But I think if we don't stay the course that this is bad timing. You know the potential for the ethanol market, who knows what? California could be big for us someday. The market is not predictable and are we supposed to depend on OPEC for our fuel supply? Half of our...half of our petroleum supply is imported. Governor Johanns will attend the Western Governor's Conference in June, and the Governor from California, Gray Davis, will be there. I think he should say that we have an ethanol industry that is viable, that's willing to produce, and, yes, even willing to expand. The thing that you don't comprehend is that if we don't pass this bill, the checkoff stays at three-quarters of a cent, the General Funds stay at \$6 million, and at the end of the
