**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** Senator Dierks, are you concluded with your opening?

**SENATOR DIERKS:** Yes, I am. Thank you.

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** Thank you, Senator, I'm sorry. Senator Beutler.

**SENATOR BEUTLER:** Senator Dierks, if you would, I'm completely unfamiliar with what the new restrictions are. What essentially are the restrictions that are...that are more onerous than they should be?

**SENATOR DIERKS:** Well, I can...I can read them to you, Senator Beutler. They're...they're what they call proposed risk mitigation measures. Number one is what they call notification of authorities and on-site workers. Number two is requirement for certified applicators. Number three is prohibit aeration of rail cars, railroad boxcars, other vehicles and containers on route. Placarding fumigated structures, containers and vehicles. Number five is establish an incident reporting program. Six is personal protective equipment. Seven requires two-man operation for any activity that would involve entry into a fumigated structure. Eight would establish a 500 foot barrier or buffer zone and restricted area around all fumigated structures. Nine, institute more thorough monitoring around the commodity. Ten requires seal/leak testing for fumigated structures. Eleven, establish a minimum distance from residences for burrow use and for PBE for applicators during these applications. Twelve is notification of local residents. Thirteen is requirement for improved training for certified applicators. Fourteen is monitoring methods to minimize exposure. And fifteen is establish and define applicable exposure limits for the label. Now, all of those are not bad, but some of them are. Oh, Senator Beutler, one of the things that we're concerned about with requirement for certified applicators, they already are certified, and I think that's kind of a duplication of effort. With this business of prohibiting aeration of rail cars and railroad boxcars or other vehicles,
