admittedly, and perhaps challenges some members' idea of equity. And I respect that. But if I may have an analogy, if you have a house afire with ten individuals in it and you have time to save two of them, what is equity going to get you? Ten people perishing in the fire. This doesn't pretend to solve every concern, but it does solve some concerns. And that is why I bring it before you. You know, we can't, it's the old starfish thing, we can't save everybody, we can't make it perfect, but I'm going to attempt to do my best to try to make it as close as I can to solving this problem. In further dialogue with members, I understand there will be a comprehensive review of our homestead exemption as it applies to veterans, disabled Nebraskans, and older Nebraskans, and a new needs versus resources test will be developed. And I'm sure Senator Wickersham will probably allude to that. And maybe that's where the solution needs to be, and I respect that. And perhaps if there's assurances that these situations, that work will continue and these situations won't be allowed to exist in Nebraska law here on out, in the future, when we do come back next session with legislation to address this problem, perhaps that's a reason why some members may not support the motion to return. And I'll understand that. But I simply did not want to withdraw my amendment, withdraw my motion to return to Select and simply, well, I hope it gets solved by an interim study, because I think each and every one of us needs to be aware of the situation that exists with our homestead exemption. It might take a lot of work on behalf of some people who are experts in this field; might have a lot of wrinkled brows, and perhaps a few late hearings. But I believe that's what we're here to do. No matter how difficult our job is trying to solve this problem, how much more difficult is it to be a disabled Nebraskan, to simply find out when they turned the age of 65 that their disability check is now turned into a Social Security retirement check, and I can't stay on the homestead exemption? This is why I presented this idea before you.
