All in favor vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on the Chambers amendment. Have you all voted? We're voting on the Chambers amendment. Have you all voted? Record, please.

CLERK: 6 ayes, 9 nays, Madam President, on the amendment as offered by Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment fails.

CLERK: Senator Chambers would move to reconsider that vote, Madam President.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Chambers, to open on your reconsideration motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Madam President. Members of the Legislature, I must do in the same way sometimes that the Speaker will do in terms of laying out the overall strategy. Some reporters have been asking what my intentions are, and other people have, and I said to take the bill as long as I need to take it. And some people said, well, everything of significance is gone. Well, no, it isn't. There are other bills at various stages of debate. And I certainly would not try to take every bill eight hours; that would be totally unreasonable. But I'm sure various sponsors would not mind donating two or three hours to me in order to help facilitate what I consider to be positive and wise legislating. So I've been told that we're going eight hours on this today, and I'm prepared to do so. And I will demonstrate that it can be done, but not just this bill, there are other bills that are on the agenda, not just today, but on other days to come. That's just so that we all know where things are. Senator Raikes, and this discussion is for the record.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Raikes, will you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't even see Senator...
