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that hasn't met in Nebraska in the previous three years. So that if we have a convention in this state in which half the people have been coming from out of state, but they've gone to Grand Island, let's say, or to another city, that convention can't count, because that convention has been held in Nebraska in the previous three years.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay, okay.

SENATOR LANDIS: Those two ways will tell you that you're not moving business from Grand Island to Omaha, Lincoln to Omaha, or whatever, and Omaha gets credit, but it's not genuinely new business.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, I suspect you probably talked some...about some of this stuff, but I didn't get in on the conversation. I want to get...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...these things clear in my mind, because I can't support something I don't understand. And, totally,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...I don't understand this. There's a couple other questions I have to ask you when I have more time. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Raikes, you're recognized to speak.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Senator Landis, I wonder if I could ask you a couple questions to...to continue on.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Landis?

SENATOR RAIKES: We're talking about people coming from out of state, have to be 50 percent or more people from out of state in order to qualify. Are we going to...to be concerned with where the people stay while they're attending the convention? For
