CLERK: Page 1, line 10, put a period after the word "events" and strike "for instruction and education for (sic) the participants".

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, I see it on my sheet. Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk and Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Should...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Landis, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Should I open on...amendment?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Sorry about that.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Chambers has raised a number of points and I've tried to give a definition of a lease purchase revenue bond to answer that question. Senator Chambers indicated that he thought others might want to take something out of his hide. Let me be very explicit because sometimes in politics we say things through code and the thing that comes to mind immediately here is LB 76. I just want to tell Senator Chambers...oh, he's doing some work. This is not in the form of a question, Senator Chambers,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...but...it's not in the form of a question, but I just wanted to let you know there is nothing that could occur on this bill, good, bad, indifferent, time or otherwise, that would alter at least my perception of the value of any other bill, and I intend to vote for every bill that I otherwise would vote for. That's sort of code. What that means is LB 76. I couldn't imagine any relationship between this one and that one and I would be deeply offended if I thought there would be. That's a good bill and I intend to vote yes for it no matter what. Now, let me move on to the topic of the bill here. I do have a set of amendments that I've filed. In fact, they're very long down the list and, frankly, some of them stem from some suggestions Senator Chambers made to the general proponents out
