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gambling because when I bet on a sure thing that's not gambling. When the outcome is uncertain and the one laying the wager has nothing to do with determining the outcome, that's not gambling.

SENATOR TYSON: Then I've got my dollar here. All we need is a stakeholder. Here, hold on...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Landis put his hand up.

SENATOR TYSON: Senator Landis, you will volunteer. No, I've got a page coming. We'll do this in style. Now Senator Lynch is back saying if I involve the... (speaking to the page) are you 18 and able to handle money? Would you give that to Senator Landis and you're the witness. Now everybody's a witness to this. Senator Chambers was able to make it over as far as Senator Landis and back. And I want the Chamber to know that it's not that I'm not in sympathy with Senator Chambers. It's no mystery to anybody here that I think that this is a bad bill. They have the Orpheum Theater that requires a subsidy by the city, but a subsidy by the city can also be described as a drain on taxpayers' money. They have the city auditorium. That requires a subsidy from the city. That subsidy from the city can also be called a drain on the taxpayers' money. Rosenblatt Stadium requires a subsidy from the city--another drain on the taxpayers' money. What's going to happen at the city convention center is that, number one, the city will be using tax money to pay off the bonds, general obligation bonds. They will be required to tax...to subsidize the facility when it is done. They can have all sorts of accounting tricks to say, well, this is new money. That may be. If this is such a good deal, why does not the business community of the city of Omaha band together, pledge their credit, they don't have to come up with the money, pledge their credit, borrow the money, build this? They will profit by it. They say they will. They say that everybody will. Here is their chance to be public benefactors. You know, in ancient Greece there was no taxation, per se, and a lot of the buildings that are now looked upon as the monuments of antiquity, the Wonders of the World, were built by private donations...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.
