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would generate about \$3 million a year. Of that amount, of that \$3 million, 30 percent would go into the fund. Thirty percent of \$3 million is \$900,000.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay, well...and so...so we understand it's basically...it's only based on estimate. There's no guarantee of that, obviously, and I understand that...

SENATOR BRUNING: Yes.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...but I just...I just wanted to know how...I assumed that's how you come up with that number. Anyway, thank you, Senator Bruning, for taking some time to visit with me and I'm going to be listening and hopefully get some more insight into what the whole proposition is so that I can...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...understand the issue more clearly as we move down the line. With that, thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Chambers, on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm wondering why those who support this bill have not focused on that parking facility that is to be connected. When we look at the definition of convention and meeting center facility, we see that there is to be an on-site directly connected parking facility for the use of the convention and meeting center facility, so the parking is a part of it. How much will a parking facility cost? I'd like to ask Senator Wickersham a question, if he knows the answer.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wickersham, would you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wickersham, when the term "parking facility" is used in statute, that doesn't refer to just a
