restaurants and the shops, everything. They spend their money in our city. The convention center, the bill that you're voting on, will do the same type of thing. But, Senator Tyson, when you spoke of Rosenblatt, I think you're misguided. That brings in much more revenue than the city has ever spent on it in a given year. With that, I'd yield the rest of my time to Senator Hilgert.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bruning. Senator Hilgert, you have about two minutes, three minutes left.

SENATOR HILGERT: Okay. Thank you, Mr. President, members. I just rise to also echo Senator Bruning's comments regarding the World Series as well as his comments regarding Rosenblatt Stadium. Certainly is important to my district. It's important I think to my neighborhoods as well. It's an anchor. It's something that we take pride in. It provides some jobs for the people in the area. They do a wonderful job maintaining it and Senator Bruning is a hundred percent right when he talks about the people coming from outside the state. In fact, one year we even had, I think it was two years ago, some folks from Louisiana who came and even visited the Legislature and, admittedly, it was the University of Nebraska Memorial Stadium which drew them to Lincoln, not our State Capitol, but they came nonetheless and they spent their money here. But it is somewhat of an anchor. It complements well with our Henry Doorly Zoo and certainly is a good use of our tax dollars. And I thank Senator Bruning for the opportunity that he gave me to talk about Rosenblatt Stadium. Thank you.
