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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Do you yield, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Chambers, I'm sure you're well-aware of the parking situation in downtown Omaha. It's awfully hard to find a parking place there and this is one of the things I hear from people who commute into...into the inner city. Would you, your opinion, could this be...could this garage be utilized by people who commute downtown every day?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, I'm not sure exactly in terms of blocks or miles how far these U.P. yards, which they're talking about using, would be from downtown. but if they are the distance that I think they are, I doubt that people would want to park that far and then walk to their offices downtown, but maybe somebody who has a better notion of the actual distance would be able to answer your question better.

SENATOR JANSSEN: How...just exactly how far is this? Let's say from the First National Bank Building?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why don't you ask Senator Brashear. He may know.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: He may have a better idea of the relative distances...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...because I just don't.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Brashear, would you answer that question for me, please?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Brashear?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, Mr. Chairman. Senator Janssen, I
