SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...guaranteed by the city of Omaha and that will be part of when the...when this is brought in front of the electorate to vote on this, that will be one of the...that will be one of the qualifications that the city or the people who live in the...people who live in the city of Omaha or in Douglas County or wherever the vote's going to be taken, this will be part of that. The guarantee for the bonds will also have to come from the people who will be voting on it. The state has no obligation whatsoever on those bonds. Now if I'm saying this right, I hope I am, that is something that people are going to have to consider. Of course, that will be the whole thing in a nutshell anyway, is the financial end of this. It will be...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...that burden will be placed upon the people...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...who will vote.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Seeing no further lights, Senator Chambers, you're recognized to close on FA158 to FA147.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. And, Senator Janssen, with reference to this parking facility, it has to be connected to the convention center. It cannot simply be nearby. It has to be connected to it, based on the language of the bill. And, as Senator Paul Hartnett was pointing out, that First National Center is going to have a lot of parking so you summed it up and sized it up correctly I think when you pointed out that if no activity is going on there the facility is going to be just sitting, including this parking area. And also, they're going to have to spend a considerable amount of money cleaning up that sump hole that is the Union Pacific yards. When they have had all kinds of pollutants, chemicals, oil and whatnot dumped there, I don't know how much it's going to cost to make
