that term employment applies to those who worked for the construction company or those who'll get those low-paying jobs working for the facility, janitors, janitresses, and the other people who do those low-level, low-paying jobs. But if that is the employment which is to be taken into consideration, I'm sure we all know that not a substantial or even a considerable amount of tax revenue will be generated from the salaries paid to those people. So that will be so negligible in terms of the amount that it could be stricken from the bill and not even taken into consideration. But when you're on shaky ground and you have a razor-thin margin of error, you don't want anything to be taken away from you that might help you not approach that razor-thin margin by too much. So the attributable inc...revenue is an area that I think requires some refinement and some clarification. In the definition of bonds, bond, I think it should be made clear that it's highly unlikely that any lease-purchase arrangement is even possible in terms of the Omaha Convention Center, and that is because the facility to be eligible for any purpose must be publicly owned, and there would be nothing to be gained by the city leasing a structure that it owns to itself. So we can do away with this notion of lease-purchase bond. That's not going to happen. The revenue bonds could come into play after the facility is up and running, and...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...when you look at any revenue that might be generated by that attached or connected parking facility. But the underlying item which will be relied on to get this thing off the ground, up and running, will be a general obligations bond issue.
