SENATOR LANDIS: And that would be consistent with the representation that you made.

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Lynch. I am, at the conclusion of this talk, I'm going to go have a chance to chat with Ernie because it seems to me that we would take them up in this order. We would...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...take up the vote percentage first. We would take up the intent language package, and we would review that because there are some elements that come out of Senator Chambers' amendments that he gave to Senator Lynch on Friday, to me on Senator...and to me on Friday, and there are some other provisions by the Revenue Committee counsel and, frankly, there's at least one provision in there that came to us from Senator Beutler. That I think should happen second. Third, I think we should go back to those and identify those issues and be able to report to the body what the additional issues there are that we focus our attention on. And I would propose that as an agenda at the point at which we...we could go forward, and that would be whenever we have the chance to get these amendments in, either as amendments to amendments or whatever. And with that, I will pursue whether or not that agenda can go forward yet this afternoon. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Landis. To continue discussion on the Chambers amendment, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I can understand Senator Lynch's comment about not if he knew what's in people's minds, I want to make clear what's in mine. And, Senator Lynch, I am only speaking for me now, just me. I'm going to accept Senator Landis's proposal about the vote and that is in a separate amendment which I'm willing to allow to substitute for whichever my next amendment is. And then when we get to this package of amendments that he gave, there is one that I would like to kind of flesh out a little bit more, on the board, the majority of the board corpsmen, some things like that
