PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Landis. The question is the adoption of FA226 to AM1830 to LB 382. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the amendment to the amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to. Discussion on AM1830. Senator Landis waives closing. The question is the adoption of AM1830 as amended to LB 382. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Landis's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment, Senator Chambers, FA160. If I may be presumptuous, Senator, to withdraw...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

CLERK: ...and offer as a substitute Senator Landis's AM1805.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Correct.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Without objection, so ordered. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. I believe Senator Chambers and I have agreed to the idea that one of these sections should be separated out and we'll ask for a division of the question. I believe that's what's going to happen here, but let me explain the amendment generally and then we'll pull out the one issue with concern for you all. Senator Chambers redrafted the intent language and gave Senator Lynch and myself a copy on Friday. Both of us have reviewed it and we thought Ernie's statement was probably closer to a better statement of intent than what we had drafted earlier in the process. So that one section of this amendment is that new slimmed down, more realistic, fewer adjectives intent
