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that for a number of projects that are already being considered, Superior, Nebraska, Valentine, Nebraska, Chadron, Ogallala, and others, that that would be only a small portion of projects which are already on the drawing boards between one and five million bucks. By striking the maximum, it allows the board, or actually the Legislature to, in any one year, appropriate as much of the money, of the Department, rather, with the Legislature, appropriate what the department suggests for whatever amount of money we'd have in a year's time which could be, I suppose, up to a million dollars for a project. And, lastly, Senator Chambers suggests that even for the 30 percent kinds of projects that one of the conditions that the board was looking at, one of the criteria, should be exported into the 30 percent situation, and this criteria is the fiscal and economic capacity to finance the local share. In other words, for these 30 percent projects around the state, the fiscal and economic capacity of those cities to actually carry out their share should be among the criteria that should be considered when deciding between various applicants for the 30 percent. Those amendments were drafted by the counsel for the Revenue Committee but not...they're not Revenue Committee amendments as such. It is just that George has a familiarity with the bill and its history, had been listening to the debate, at Senator Wickersham's suggestion, and had picked up a number of the places where language could be improved. And I would ask for the adoption of the amendment, understanding that we may have some concerns about them, not the least of which is that Senator Chambers, I believe, wants to divide the question and pull out the issue of the majority vote of the board.

SENATOR SCHIMEK PRESIDING

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Chambers, I understand you want to ask for a division.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's right, Madam President, and it would be to excerpt out number 5 of these, of this list of amendments, take that alone, and let all the rest be taken as a package.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: So you're talking page 2, lines 20 and 21 would be the one part of the amendment, and then all of the rest would be the second part.
