

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE  
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LB 382

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Landis. The question is the adoption of FA227. All in favor vote aye, all opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of the first component of the Landis amendment.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: FA227 is adopted. We now move to the discussion of FA228. Senator Landis, to open on your amendment, the second part of the amendment.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Schimek. And by the way, you've kept your head while all the rest of us are losing it in determining where we are in the process. Thank you. This is subsection 5 of the FA1805 that's on your desk. I had that on your desk earlier today. Senator Chambers made the point that the language of the bill, when the board met to decide the approval had to do it by a majority vote, but we did not identify a majority of what. It could be of those attending the meeting or of those of the board, and this chooses a majority of the board. That means three of five. The reason that we pulled this out is that Senator Chambers highlighted this issue. He also, at a different time, wanted to make sure that one of those three votes was the Governor, and I'm going to anticipate that we may have a Chambers amendment here, I don't know, but that's the issue before you. The issue before you is three of five, and then Senator Chambers can just carry his own water himself.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Landis. I believe there is an amendment on the desk. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, excuse me, Senator Chambers would move to amend with FA229. (Legislative Journal page 2169.)

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Chambers, to open on your amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, what I would do is strike what Senator Landis had offered in his amendment, in lines 20 and 21, where he put "a majority of the board." This language might be on your gadget by now but this
