is what I would put, and I will explain why. Some of it will be obvious. "A majority of the board members constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting business. All actions of the board shall be by a majority vote of all the board members, one of whom must be the Governor." The constitution places the responsibility on the Governor to see that the state's business is efficiently and economically administered. Any appropriation that the Legislature would make pursuant to this particular scheme could be vetoed by the Governor, if the Governor did not agree with it. Since the legislation is placing the top official of the state on the board, I think that person should be one of the members required to be in favor of approving this application. That is the amendment. I've given the reason why I think the Governor should be there, and if you have any questions, I will answer them. But I can add this at this point, I would not like to see a situation, with all due respect to everybody on the board, where the...where three appointed persons, namely, the Chairperson of the Board of Accountancy, the Chairperson of the Investment Council, and the economic professor would be the ones making this decision. An elected official should be a part of the quorum, and not to disparage in any way the other persons, I believe that the Governor should be that elected person who would be a member of that quorum.
