SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Tyson. Senator Chambers, you're next.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I had said I would have some negative comments to make about the bill, and I will. Having filled the record with positions and views that I have, I won't have to take three times speaking on this motion. But I do not see this scheme as one beneficial to the citizens of Omaha. But the safety valve lies in the fact that they just, through the vote of fewer than 25,000 people, obliged all of the people who pay taxes in Omaha to pay considerably more to retire those bonds, and that bond issue was approved because people in Omaha are more willing to spend money to resegregate the schools than they are to spend money to improve education. So, having exhausted whatever it was that they were feeling that made them vote for that quarter of a billion dollar bond issue, I doubt that one such as this, for the purpose envisioned, will be successful. Where, brothers and sisters, in Omaha has Mr. Buffett ever spent a nickel on anything concrete or substantive? Maybe he has, and I just didn't know about it. He could be one of those unanimous donors that I don't know anything about, but I know he drinks Cokes, strawberry Coke, or whatever kind it is that he has an interest in. But he could go in his watch pocket and take out enough money to pay for this convention center and the arena, if he chose to do so. To show how small potatoes and parochial Omahans are, they go into a tizzy when Warren Buffett comes to Omaha, and these people who invest in his company and make all that money come to Omaha. Vicariously, Omahans seem to think they're all rich. A person in my scale of values is not a hero of any kind simply because he becomes obscenely rich, it shows he knows how to make money. And money, brothers and sisters, is the only thing which the holy writ, Senator Cudaback, said the love of constitutes the root of all evil. Is prostitution evil?
