control, and of course that doesn't deal with pollution of the waters of the state. So I'm not all that much in tune with what is done. But I assume the engineers doing the inspection have the criteria and a checklist of things to look for. And I have talked to the inspectors on a couple of occasions, and have accompanied them to a construction site. But in the case of existing facilities, I assume they have their criteria and their checklist and observations and know what they're doing. Certainly in this case...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...there have been complaints, and they have been checked and rechecked and checked again, I believe.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Let me try to frame an area of concern with respect, for example, with just one of the...one of the factors and elicit a response from you. With respect to (b), it says that the facility, criteria would be, has the facility been properly maintained and shows no visible signs of structural breakage below the permanent pool. And I'm not sure in that instance what you mean by permanent pool, but maybe we should start with just an explanation of what that...of what that is, because I'm not sure I understand entirely what it means without understanding what that is.
