in it, and maybe trying to talk through some of the details that we're talking through on the floor right now. And they were kind enough to do that on General File, and I thought we made some great progress. And that's really what I had in mind, being sure that we understand exactly what some of the terminology means, such as permanent pool.

SENATOR PREISTER: Okay, thank you, Senator Beutler. And given the lateness of the hour, and since this isn't a late night, perhaps that would be in the best interest of all of our time to perhaps have that discussion tonight, that may save some floor time, and that in the morning then, and I don't...I haven't seen an agenda, but it would be my guess that the Speaker may have this back on the agenda for first thing in the morning. So, it may be a good time for us to look at adjourning, save some time and then start afresh in the morning, and hopefully some of those discussions would then be able to continue. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Preister. Senator Schrock, you are recognized to speak.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, Madam President, members of the Legislature. I'll use this time to continue the conversation. Permanent pool, Senator Beutler, is the designed capacity of the lagoon when it's at its upper level. I would suppose we're using standards that are existing for Region VI of the Environmental Protection Agency here. And so I think that's the design of the lagoon as it pertains to the water level in it or the waste level in it. I'm not sure what more you're wanting at this time, but certainly the animal waste management facility is designed to hold a certain amount of waste and it's designed to hold whatever is necessary for...to keep that...it's designed to be large enough so that there is no discharges into the waters of the state. And I don't know if that's a very good explanation, but that's probably the best I can come up with now. We are using language that's provided by EPA, Region VI of this country. So, if that...if that means anything, it's not a haphazard...it's not a haphazard definition, it is a definition that is used by the industry.
