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SENATOR SCHROCK: Well, Madam President, I'll just briefly comment that I did have a livestock facility in my area of the state that did cause a minor fish kill, and I would call it minor. DEQ did come out and inspect him. And he had to re-engineer his lagoon, and he did pay a fine, and that was about three, four years ago. He did complain to me. I thought the fine was kind of a little bit on the high side, but certainly inquired but did not try to intervene. That issue has since passed, but I think that incidence did make the individual comply, did increase the capacity of his waste facility, and it's operating today and it's operating in a different manner, and in a manner that has made it an issue that is safe for the waters of this state. This particular facility is in the...would be in the watershed of the Platte River, and certainly the fish kill did not go into the Platte River, it was just on a little tributary there. And I'll be honest with you, I think the fish that they saw...found dead were probably carp. And I don't consider...I don't consider what happened to be an environmental...a disaster, but I would say it's something that probably shouldn't have continued, and it was corrected. So I think these are things that DEQ do on a regular basis.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHROCK: So I hope that this satisfies some of your questions. I don't have the answers. Certainly, certainly, we'll learn more as time goes on. But, Senator Schmitt, I appreciate your comments. I know that you've not thought that DEQ has always adequately addressed the situation. And he says he still doesn't. But I think we're getting there. This is a process that's going to take some time. And certainly with the advent of large hog facilities, which are not popular in a lot of areas of the state, it's going to take more time. And I think the larger facilities, the more critical it is that they are engineered properly and that they have proper land areas for disposal of the waste.
