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in the levy for community colleges. Now we have reduced the levy in community colleges to a maximum of 8 cents, it was over 12 cents. But we will be able to reduce the levy for community colleges further this year, not by statutorily reducing their levy limitation, but providing additional aid to them, about \$30 million in additional aid. And that \$30 million will come off all of the property tax statements in the state of Nebraska this tax year. Whether it is a real property tax statement, or whether it's a personal property tax statement. The taxes on that statement, on a statewide basis, will be \$30 million less because we're going to provide an additional \$30 million aid to community colleges this year. Now that will create a substantially reduced levy for community colleges this year, and I hope that people appreciate that unless we continued that effort and continued to provide an additional \$30 million in aid to community colleges, that that levy would go back up next year. And Senator Kristensen has an amendment that he would use to talk about that issue. But I do think that we all have to keep in mind that by providing aid for community colleges one year and reducing their levy substantially that the next year, if we do not continue that aid effort, that the levy will go back up, it is inevitable. They're going to have to find the resources to continue their programs. And their programs should be continued. The second component is \$35 million in the next tax year, the year 2000, that would be distributed to counties and appear as a credit on persons' property tax statements. This is the real property tax statement, not the personal property tax statement, the real property tax statement. There would actually be a line on your property tax statement that will describe the amount of credit that you, as an individual owner of a parcel of property, are receiving by reason of the \$35 million that we're devoting to that program. The \$35 million would be spread across the state of Nebraska, based on valuation. I hope you look at the little sheet that we distributed, give you some more of the detailed information about how that might occur. But there will actually be a line on your real property tax statement indicating the amount of credit that you will receive as your portion out of the \$35 million. That credit program is an ongoing program, although it isn't funded on an ongoing basis. The statutory provisions for future use of the credit would remain in place. The only thing that is uncertain at the moment is future funding
