individuals have delinquent taxes, that those delinquent taxes be brought to their attention so that they could cut the running of interest on those delinquent taxes. The amendment simply provides for a process of printing directly on the tax notice, a statement that back taxes and interest are due for, and then you would fill in the years. Senator Schimek's amendment was somewhat more complicated, asking for either that kind of a statement to be printed on a tax statement, or a colored piece of paper to be inserted in with the tax notices, with a somewhat longer statement attached to it. We have worked...done additional work with NACO and others to assure ourselves that the requirement that we're now bringing to you is one that they can implement without additional administrative costs. NACO runs a computer program that services 70 counties across the state of Nebraska for the printing of their tax notices. What we're suggesting to you in this amendment fits and will work within the context of that proposal. I don't know if Senator Schimek has her light on. But, Senator Schimek, if you want to make sure that you get a chance to say something, I'll yield the rest of my time to you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. And thank you, Senator Wickersham. I do rise in support of the amendment. I...I appreciate very much Senator Wickersham and his staff's work on this, because it's sometimes the little, tiny details of a plan that cause the most trouble. I feel comfortable that this will take care of the notification problem. And the reason that mine was a more complicated process, frankly, is because not all counties do their tax statements the same way. And I believe about 70 of them use the same form, the others use something different. I have been assured, because there's going to have to be a reprinting of forms anyway, the forms are going to have to be changed systemwide, that this language can be incorporated into the tax form itself. And it does read "back taxes" and "interest due for", and then it will tell what years those back taxes are due. So I am supportive of the amendment, and I thank Senator Wickersham and his staff for working on this.
