SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Oh, I...Senator, I don't know what people consider to be significant. I'll take \$35 any time somebody gives it to me...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Oh.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...if it's for the right purpose, of course.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, I think that probably is the right answer. (Laugh) Thank you. Members of the body, I...I have such mixed emotions on this bill and it's very difficult to vote against it, but I think that's what I'm probably going to end up doing for a number of reasons. First of all, I don't believe it's sustainable out into the future. I do believe that there are some significant amounts of money that we don't have budgeted yet that we are going to have to spend into the future, and I passed out the yellow sheet. I don't think that, as I said earlier, is an exhaustive list. I also think that our forecasting could go awry and, in fact, there are...there is some forecasting that says that the numbers will not be as high as we would hope out past the biennium. And then we don't know in the future what happens to the economy. I also am afraid that most of the dollars are going to go to those who have the most property. I mean that seems logical. But really, I'm being serious now, I'm not sure that those are the folks who really need the property tax relief. I'm worried that it's not those folks who are living in fixed...on fixed incomes that are going to get the most significant relief or that are going to get any significant relief that's going to make a difference to them. I think there are certain parts of the state that are definitely going to get more property tax relief than other parts of the state, and I do believe that it is going to be too small a return to the average taxpayer to make a discernible difference. They are not going to notice it. I would rather that we take this money and do it all...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...one way or the other so that there's some continuity there, so that people can see what we're actually doing. What we're doing under this compromise is jumping from
