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don't tax the taxpayer at the worst possible time. And I would submit to you, unless you think there is some great value in this tax relief, which I think almost everybody in here recognizes there is not, it's not sustainable, it's not substantial, we need to carry through on the great program that we organized a few years ago and which we are carrying through on and which does still offer, in its conceptual format and in its execution, real property tax relief, and we are continuing on that. Why we have this little "blurb" in the stream, "blurb" in the...on the scene which has the detrimental effect of...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...decimating the Reserve Fund? I don't know. It's just not worth it to me and I feel very comfortable voting against it, even if you're going to call it property tax relief. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, on occasions a colleague or two of mine may say they regret that they have to follow me in the speaking order. Today I regret I have to follow Senator Beutler, because he said what needed to be said and he said it so well. I'm looking at Senator Redfield over there doing nothing, so I'm going to ask her a question or two, if she'd be willing to respond.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Redfield.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Redfield, do you have children?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Six.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That made me a little weak in the knees. Now that I'm stabilized...(laughter)...I thought with four I had the top....okay. Do parents ever have to tell their children "no"?

SENATOR REDFIELD: They certainly do.
